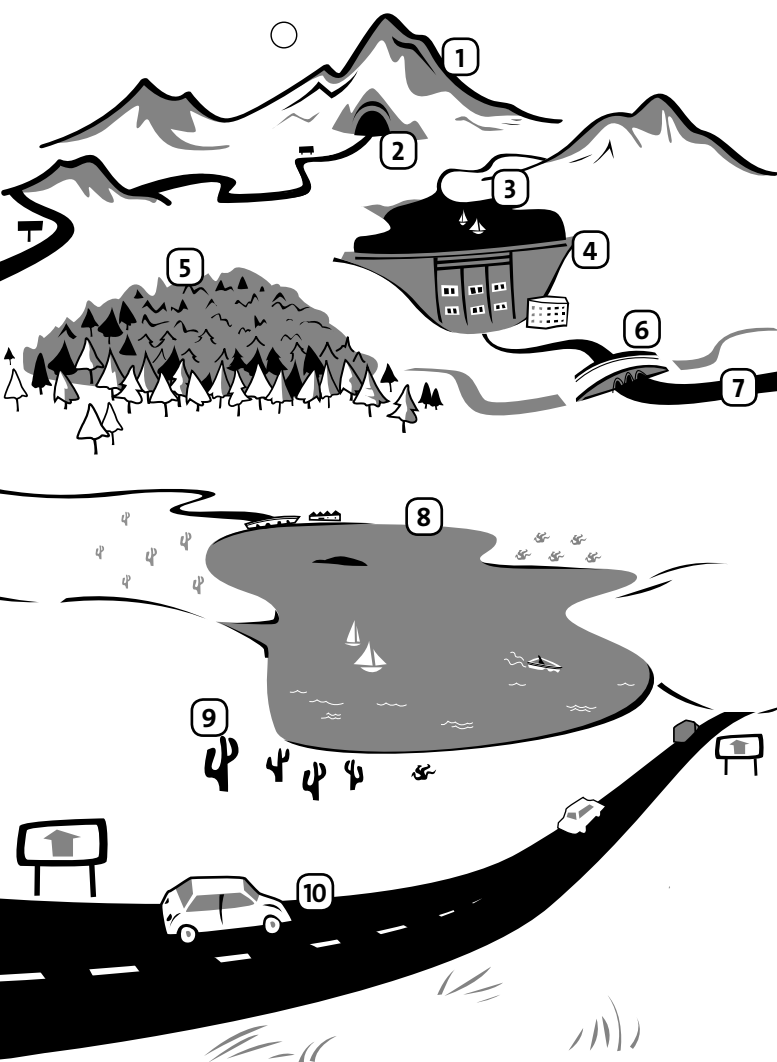


Geography: Man-made features
